Transcript: Withholding Policy for Student Records

Hello, and thank you for taking a moment to learn about our **Withholding Policy for Student Records** at the College.

This policy is in line with **Colorado House Bill 22-1049** and applies to **both current and former students** who may have outstanding debt to the College—such as tuition balances or other financial aid funds that need to be repaid.

We want to be clear:

 The College does not withhold academic records or transcripts due to outstanding financial obligations. That means, even if you owe money, your access to your academic records is not blocked.

If you do have a balance owed, you have options:

• You can contact your **campus business office** to **set up a payment plan** that works for your situation. We encourage you to reach out and make those arrangements as early as possible.

For **former students** who have not resolved their balance:

 Please be aware that after 30 to 60 days from the date of determination, the unpaid debt may be sent to a third-party collection agency. We will always attempt to work with you before that happens.

Finally, if you believe your rights under **HB22-1049** have been violated, or if you have questions or concerns, you can contact the **Colorado Student Loan Ombudsperson**. Their office can be reached by email at **CSLSA@coag.gov**.
